On October 27th (Rockville) Dr. Scott Aaronson, President of the Maryland Psychiatric Society, from Sheppard Pratt Hospital, will be speaking with us about Novel Drugs and Devices for Treatment Resistant Depression. He is Clinical Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Maryland School of Medicine and is the Director of Clinical Research at Sheppard Pratt Hospital. He is the principal investigator for multiple studies on the development of novel therapies for mood, anxiety and psychotic disorders He is the Director of Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation Services there. Location to be determined. He has published numerous publications and spoken extensively, and is considered an expert on the subject of Treatment Resistant Depression.

On November 24th (Bethesda) Dr. Jennifer Payne from Johns Hopkins Women's Mood Disorders Clinic will be presenting a salon entitled Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders: Debunking Myths and Advances in Treatment Options. She is Associate Professor of Psychiatry at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, and Director of the Women's Mood Disorder Center and the Mood Disorders Clinical Trials Group as well as as Co-Director of the Resident Outpatient Program. She has published and lectured extensively and is considered a national expert on women's reproductive mental health.

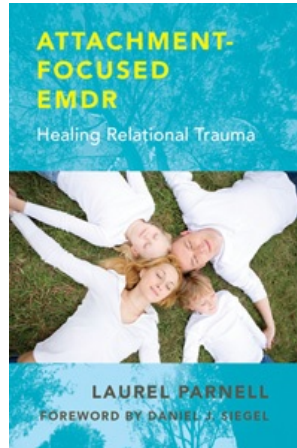

GIUSEPPE SCARCELLA, MD

March 8, 1922 - August 30, 2013

It is with great sadness that I am announcing the death of Giuseppe Scarcella, M.D., husband of Erminia Scarcella, M.D. and the father of their son, Alex, a pilot with Jet Blue Airline. Giuseppe was born on March 8, 1922 in Italy and died on

August 30, 2013 in Washington, DC. He was a very young 91 years old when he succumbed to a complication of renal cancer.

In Italy, he trained as a neurosurgeon and worked primarily in Austria and Sweden. When he married Erminia in 1978, they moved to the United States where he trained to become a psychiatrist and he was able to work until one year ago at age 90. His work here included being Chairman of the Department of Psychiatry at the Veterans Administration Hospital in the 1970's in Washington, DC. At the conclusion of this position, he continued working at the Arlington Court. He also worked as a consultant doing evaluations of pensions and compensation.

Giuseppe was an extremely bright and lively man. He died as he lived: with his privacy, his dignity and his beloved family. His life needs to be celebrated and remembered by his smile and his witty and spicy sentences.

There will be a memorial service for him on Saturday, November 2, 2013, at the Church of the Annunciation, 3810 Massachusetts Avenue, NW, Washington, DC. It will start at 11:00 AM with a reception next door catered by Luigi Donadio, owner of ALITRAMISU.

Dr. Tartaglia, Georgetown University B.S. 1958, M.D. 1962 served in the US Air Force and has been on the Georgetown University medical faculty continuously since 1968, having served as Director of Student Mental Health services from 1988-2001. A memorial service was held at Holy Redeemer Catholic Church, Summit Ave. and Cable Drive, Kensington, MD, 20895 on Saturday, September 21, 2013 where a Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at Interment Gate of Heaven Cemetery.

ARMON A. CAIRO, a psychiatrist and an internist who practiced at Sibley Memorial Hospital in Washington for more than 45 years and taught at the Georgetown University medical school, died Sept. 15 at his home in Bethesda. He was 88.

The cause was complications from a stroke, said his daughter Cathy Patrick.

Dr. Cairo began working at Sibley Memorial in 1965. He became a senior attending physician in 1990 and practiced until his retirement in 2012. He began teaching medicine at Georgetown in 1954 and was an associate clinical professor of psychiatry from 1972 to 2012. He was a former director of the diagnostic clinic and cancer detection clinic at Georgetown University Hospital. He also worked as a medical consultant to the Social Security Administration's Bureau of Hearings and Appeals from 1970 to 2012.

Born in Steelton, Pa. He was a 1945 chemistry graduate of Franklin & Marshall College in Lancaster, Pa.,

and graduated from the Georgetown medical school in 1948. He served in the Navy during World War II and was a division medical officer in the Korean War.

Dr. Cairo was a past psychiatric consultant to the mental-health commission at St. Elizabeths Hospital in Washington, the Washington Clinic and the juvenile court of Montgomery County. He was a past president of the Eastern Psychoanalytic Association, and his memberships included the American Psychiatric Association, the Georgetown Clinical Society and the Washington Psychiatric Society.

Survivors include his wife of 58 years, Laurie Jones Cairo of Bethesda; and many children and grandchildren.
